

Intellectual Property and Copyright Infringement

Students engaging in dissertation research at Pacifica Graduate Institute own the copyright to their finished work. They are legally and ethically responsible for any infringement of copyright and intellectual property law and may be subject to a lawsuit if they do not comply. Students should allow up to four months to get necessary permissions prior to submitting the dissertation final draft for committee review.

Students complete, sign and submit this form at the time they complete the dissertation proposal.

You are not permitted to make unauthorized reproductions of copyrighted materials in your dissertation and agree not to do so. Such copyrighted material does **not** include brief text quotations from another work, but such excerpts must be properly cited to avoid plagiarism.

Do not assume that since you are writing an academic dissertation that your use of copyrighted materials will be deemed to be "fair use."

Contact the copyright owner of each work used in the dissertation and request express written permission to use the material, whether it is published or unpublished, then document the requests by keeping copies of any letters or email correspondence.

Make it clear to the copyright holder that the dissertation will be published online by ProQuest.

Keep copies of every permission statement in your own files, submit a full set of permission statements to the dissertation chair along with the final draft of the work, and upload a full set of permission statements with the final copy edited manuscript.
