From Pacifica's creation to support Vietnam veterans and untie the knots in the human heart formed from the cultural upheaval of the 1970s, our work has evolved into our current mission of helping a broader audience by tending soul of and in the world.

On this, the eleventh day of November, we rightly acknowledge the brave military men and women for their fearless and selfless service to their fellow Americans. Although our veterans have served in different eras, they all share common experiences that deserve our respect, compassion, and support. As the mental health crisis looms, notably with a disproportionate number of veterans, there continues to be a drastic shortage of licensed professionals to assist those with emotional and psychological needs. We need more professional counselors, psychologists, and therapists, as the demand for professional service does not seem like it will diminish anytime soon. Pacifica's depth therapists, clinicians, and resources can help flatten this curve, and we send acknowledgment and appreciation to all those engaged in this work in their communities and with our veterans.

As an employer, educational institution, and support network, Pacifica is committed to attracting, developing, and retaining America's military veterans - highly skilled individuals with much to offer. We are fortunate to have active and veteran service members within the Pacifica community, including over 30 veterans currently enrolled, many of whom are receiving VA benefits. We are proud to state that Pacifica has certified more than 100 students for VA benefits over the years.

In addition, we are proud to support and partner with organizations that focus on building relationships between employers and veterans. Our Alumni Association (PGIAA) continues to provide resources and services by professional counselors through their <u>PGIAA Support</u> <u>Network</u> for individuals in need of assistance, within our Pacifica community and beyond, including with their <u>CareLine (805-679-6163)</u> and Return the Gift initiative. Please also take a moment to read our <u>Alumni Spotlight on Eduard Uzumeckis, Ph.D.</u> (Mythological Studies class of 2011), a disabled veteran of the Vietnam War. Through the <u>Yellow Ribbon program</u>, Pacifica provides scholarships each year for qualifying veterans under the Post 9/11 GI Bill® on a first-come, first-serve basis. Students in the M.A.

Counseling Psychology program will qualify for up to \$6,500 per year, M.A. Depth Psychology and Creativity will qualify for up to \$5,400 per year, and those in the doctoral programs will qualify for up to \$7,800 per year.
