



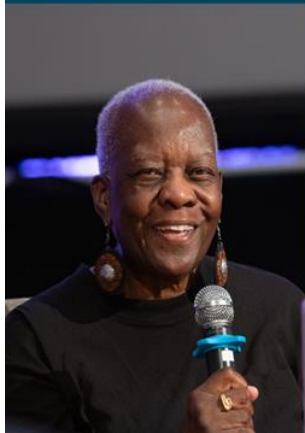
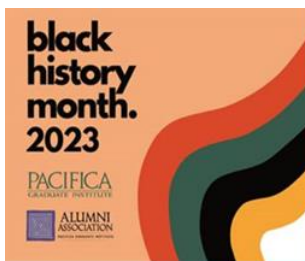
Black History Month: Community Spotlight - Dr. Fanny Brewster

Pacifica Community Member Spotlight Fanny Brewster, Ph.D., M.F.A., LP

- One of the first African American/Black Students at Pacifica Graduate Institute in 1993.
- Holds a Doctorate in Clinical Psychology from Pacifica and is a graduate of the C.G. Jung Institute of New York. She is a New York State Licensed Psychoanalyst and Certified School Psychologist.
- Core faculty member in Pacifica's Depth Psychology Specialization in Integrative Therapy and Healing Practices (DPT); also teaches within the Jungian & Archetypal Studies (DJA) specialization and Clinical Psychology program
- Chair of Pacifica's Diversity and Inclusion Council
- Analyst member of the Philadelphia Association of Jungian Analysts. A former Board Member of the New York Analytical Psychology Club. A faculty member of the C.G. Jung Foundation of New York.
- An international speaker, lecturer, and workshop presenter on Dreamwork, Africanist Culture, Diversity, and Creativity.
- Nominee of three Gradiva Awards for her writing from the National Association for the Advancement of Psychoanalysis. Her most recent nomination was for *The Racial Complex: a Jungian Perspective on Culture and Race*. (Routledge)
- A Jungian analyst and author of poetry and nonfiction:
